Using Pictures Clarification

An issue was recently raised connected to recruitment and the lack of consent when using photographs of bowlers and supporters on flyers circulated to local towns and villages. This matter has been discussed with, and clarified by, the Bowls England legal team. It is confirmed the use of photographs without using any personal information about individuals is legal and requires no consent.
