ROLE DESCRIPTION

MEN'S PRESIDENT

This is the highest honour a player can hold within the County.

The primary role of the President is to be the figurehead and main representative for all aspects of Bowls Surrey during his period in office.

Who will I work with?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bowls Surrey Management Committee, officers especially Administrator, General Secretary, Match Secretaries, his Vice President, plus those on other Committees as required.
What will I do?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attend all Men's & Mixed matches. Attend and support the Senior Team Manager and Team at Middleton Cup, Balcomb Trophy and Home Counties matches and the Over 60s Mixed Inter County matches (shared with the Women's President). Attend and support Walter Cross games. Attend County Quarter and Semi-finals. Attend County Finals Day and present trophies. Present Awards to recipients. Arrange County President's Day. Attend County Dinner, present trophies. Attend Bowls Surrey Management Committee meetings and AGM. Attend County Selection meetings. Attend Awards Committee meetings. Attend Bowls England Championships to support the players. Ensuring attendance for the Players Badge presentation and Trophy (if won). Ensure that Bowls Surrey standards and protocols are upheld. Always wear County uniform when on duty.
How much time will I need to give?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is difficult to say, as it will vary from year to year, however, it will be very time-consuming and tiring.
What do I need to do this role?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To be approachable and friendly. Excellent communication skills – verbal and written. Well organised and disciplined . Healthy, as the role is very demanding.
